Don't be afraid of the scenic route.

If you're like me, I always want the fastest and most direct route. I have places to go and people to see. I want to do it right the first time with no mistakes. The scenic route has unknowns. What if it takes longer, it might be all gravel, what if there's no gas station?

What's the point here?

Since the new year, my heart has been stirring to pursue offering some sort of counseling service.
